

History of the AAPM-DVC

The Philadelphia Radiological Physicists was formed on February 28, 1952 by John Hale and Robert Gorson of

University Hospital

S. Reid Warren, Jr. and Ferdinand Werner of University of Pennsylvania James Bierly of

Jefferson and Pennsylvania Hospitals George Henney of

Temple Hospital James Weatherwax and Theodore Miles of

Oncologic Hospital Theodore Sopp of Philadelphia General, Hahnemenn, and Jewish Hospitals.

During the meeting, the founding members elected leadership and formed committees with specific oversight goals. It was decided that the society would meet on the last Thurday of every month.

The first official meeting was held on March 27, 1952. The members would discuss interhospital problems and the future directions of the group.

The Philadelphia Radiological Physicists assimilated into the American Association of Physicists in Medicine when the organization was formed in 1958.
